Sixty-nine years ago, July 3rd, 1955, members of the Class of 1959 walked through Gate 3 to begin a lifetime of service to our nation. Now we gather to celebrate our 65th Reunion. We have developed a remarkable class legacy over the years. Most importantly has been the comradeship, friendship and support we have maintained for each other over time. This weekend is another opportunity to reinforce those bonds and to remember and honor our classmates who are on longer with us, many of whom gave their lives in the service of our country.

Today the Naval Academy is vastly different from the Academy we left in 1959. New buildings and facilities have replaced many that we utilized. The daily life of a Midshipman doesn't include marching to class to the sound of a drumbeat, slide rules, etc. However, this present generation of midshipmen (including both men and women) does abide by the same set of values that we had. The Academy's

mission hasn't changed. Midshipmen are serving their country and communities well just as we did.

Our 50th Reunion gift from the Class to the Academy was the Oratory at the Columbarium. And a Data Base Computer System was also funded by the Class of 1959. This system provides, via a touch screen, the location of persons who are interred in the Columbarium or buried in the USNA cemetery. Fittingly, services have been held at this beautiful, serene spot for many of our departed classmates.

Unfortunately, this past spring, the Navy Facilities team discovered that Ramsay Road, the road in front of the Columbarium, had eroded to a point that required partial closure to ensure the safety of motorists. Leadership at the Naval Academy has determined that immediate repairs to Ramsay Road and installation of a seawall are required to protect against future flooding. To allow for these necessary repairs, the Columbarium and the surrounding areas was closed on August 30, 2024. During this period of construction, Ramsay Road will be closed to all foot and vehicular traffic for a period of approximately 18 months. Accordingly, we regret that the Columbarium stop on the planned Bus Tour had to be eliminated.

The rest of our activities for the weekend as highlighted in the Schedule of Events on pages 5-7 will go on as planned. So, relax, tell sea stories, eat, drink and be merry, share good times with old friends and cheer on **NAVY as we triumph over AIR FORCE**. "Rise and Shine with '59".

Helpful Information

The following information is provided to make your 65th Reunion Weekend in Annapolis as enjoyable as possible.

Check-in. Official check-in for the weekend is accomplished in the Calvert Room at the Crowne Plaza. At 10:00am on Saturday, registration will be shifted to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium N* Room. Classmates who arrive not having previously registered should expect to pay with check, cash or credit card before they will be officially registered and checked in.

At check-in each registered classmate will receive a tote bag and the following items:

- Name badge for each registered person. These name badges must be worn to all reunion events to both identify the wearer as a registered class member or his spouse/accompanied guest and to facilitate recognition during the reunion. The name badge will also permit access to the Midshipmen Store.
- The Gouge, which will include a welcome letter, the Schedule of Events, and detailed and helpful information for the entire weekend including a list of Reunion Committee members with their cell phone numbers.

Hotel. The Crowne Plaza Hotel has been selected as our base of operations. Plentiful parking is available outside in front of the hotel and is free of charge.

Transportation. Bus transportation is provided between the hotel and the Yard for all scheduled reunion events. The buses will be clearly marked with Class of ‘59 on the front and side. Bus transportation to religious services at the USNA chapel will also be provided. A detailed bus schedule with important contact information will be included in your check-in package.

Reunion attendees are **encouraged** to use the buses provided at the Crowne Plaza Hotel for travel to and from the Yard. The bus schedules are designed to transport you to the scheduled reunion events. This bus service will assist you to have a pleasant, memorable and worry-free experience during the reunion weekend.

Security Measures/Yard Access. Pedestrian access to the Yard requires a valid photo ID. Suggest you always carry a photo ID when you are away from the hotel. The reunion name badge by itself will not allow entry into the Yard. However, it is suggested that you always wear the reunion name badge whenever you are attending a function or going into the Yard. The reunion name badge is required for access to and purchases at the Midshipmen Store.

Only vehicles driven by active-duty military, retired military with a valid ID, or with valid handicapped decals/stickers will be permitted to drive onto the Yard. A

photo ID is required for the driver and passengers. Parking within the Yard is very limited, especially during normal working hours.

Welcome Cocktail Reception. A cocktail party will be held for all attendees on Thursday evening from 5:00pm to 8:00pm in the Crowne Plaza Queen Anne Ballroom. Welcome your classmates and enjoy drinks, beer, wine, or sodas at a cash bar. Heavy hors d'oeuvres are complimentary, funded by generous donations from some of our classmates who have asked to remain anonymous.

Fun Walk. Pete Stout is leading a Fun Walk on Saturday from 7:30am to 8:30am, departing from the Crowne Plaza Hotel on a local route. Canes and walkers are welcome.

Memorial Service. The Memorial Service honoring our recently departed classmates will be from 10:00am to 11:30am on Friday at the Naval Academy Chapel. Buses will run from 8:30am to 9:30am from the Crowne Plaza Hotel to the Chapel

Light Refreshments. A light luncheon buffet for those who opted to go will be served at the USNA Club after the Memorial Service. Welcome briefings will be presented by the Academy Provost, the Alumni Association, and the Athletic Association.

Company/Battalion Dinner Banquet. There will be a cocktail social hour and a Company/Battalion buffet for attendees and guests, who opted to go, in the Crowne Plaza Ballroom "A" on Friday evening from 5:00pm to 10:00pm. This event is in lieu of the Company Parties held in previous reunions. Companies and/or Battalions will be seated together as much as possible.

Yard Tours. Bus tours of the Preble Hall Museum, the USNA Visitors Center, the Sports Museum - Terwilliger Center, the Midshipmen Store, the Grace Hopper Cyber Building, the new Alumni Center - Fluegel Hall will take place on Thursday from 11:00am - 4:30 and Friday from 2:00pm - 4:00pm.

Navy vs Air Force Football Game N* Room Buffet. The first buses begin to depart from the Crowne Plaza to the N* Room in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium on Saturday, at 9:30am. The N* buffet, for those who signed up, will be catered by Bo Brooks. This "all-you-can-eat buffet" will include beer, wine, sodas,

bottled water, coffee, and hot tea. The away football game will be viewed on multiple TVs throughout the N* Room. Beverages and snacks will be provided during the second half until near the end of the game. Buses will begin to shuttle back to the Hotel at about 2:00pm and will continue until an hour after the game ends. You are encouraged to park at the reunion hotel and use the Class of '59 buses to go to and from the Stadium. The Annapolis Sailboat Show and a Band Competition on the football field that weekend will impact parking and there will be a charge to park at the Stadium.
